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2. Approve Minutes of October 9, 2012	Motioned by District Attorney Mike Ramos and seconded by Public Defender Phyllis Morris to approve minutes as written; unanimous.																
3. Approve Amended Mintues	<p>Minutes were amended to accurately identify Executive Committee members and other attendees for June 13, 2011; August 30, 2011; November 30, 2011; March 19, 2012; April 3, 2012 and May 29, 2012.</p> <p>Amend April 3, 2012 minutes to reflect motion by District Attorney Mike Ramos instead of Gerry Newcombe.</p> <p>Motioned by District Attorney Mike Ramos and seconded by Linda Haugen to approve minutes as amended; unanimous.</p>																

<p>4. Funding Request</p>	<p>Chief Rod Jones, Fontana Police Department, submitted funding request of \$400,250 for the Fontana Re-entry Support Team.</p> <p>Committee waited until 11:00 a.m. to discuss funding request, allowing Chief Rod Jones time to arrive. Chief Jones did not attend the meeting.</p> <p>The Fontana Re-entry Support Team was implemented to reduce recidivism rates among early release prisoners and probationers. This is a good program that provides supportive services to ensure their success into the community.</p> <p>Additional money from Prop 30 could support this program. All cities are providing services to Post Release Community Supervision offenders without additional funding.</p> <p>AB109 funding is limited and should be utilized for AB109 projects with the Day Reporting Centers providing services countywide.</p> <p><u>ACTION:</u> Motioned by District Attorney Mike Ramos and seconded by Sheriff John McMahon to deny funding request; unanimous with Judge Slough abstaining from vote.</p>
<p>5. Year One Statistics AB109 Annual Report</p>	<p>Introduction of Mary O’Toole who volunteered for this special project to develop the AB109 annual report. State has not provided guidelines on what information must be included in the report and will accept any information. County determines what meaningful information to include in report.</p> <p>Mary O’Toole asked what data is available, how each agency tracks data, and what additional duties are outside the norm. Recommended that additional duties be documented. The report needs to capture how the County is doing more with less and what additional duties and costs are being generated. The information gathered will assist the Chief Executive Officer to appeal for additional funding. Each department requested to provide two staff names to assist with this project: one employee knowledgeable of programs and the other employee knowledgeable of data information.</p> <p>Linda Haugen – Report should include outcomes on where funding was used.</p> <p>Michelle Brown – Grand Jury has already requested AB109 report.</p>

	<p>Recidivism can be defined more than one way. Committee agreed that recidivism needs a common definition or an explanation for varying statistics.</p>
<p>6. Roundtable</p>	<p><u>Chief Brown</u> Dispatch was overlooked In the 2012-2013 budget and no money was added. Sheriff will be adding three dispatchers. Another additional cost will be Mobile Data Computers (MDC) for vehicles. Probation used MDCs on a trial basis in 10 vehicles and outcome was good.</p> <p>If there is an increase in AB109 funds, unknown what percentage the County will receive. Growth money is separate.</p> <p>Department of Behavioral Health staff doing great job providing services. Out of 63 PC245 cases recently returned to the County, 18 were enhanced outpatients.</p> <p><u>ACTION:</u> Departments to submit their FY 2013/2014 budget at next CCP meeting.</p> <p><u>Sheriff McMahon</u> Jail beds limited; people sentenced locally instead of going to state.</p> <p>Using SB 1022 money for Glen Helen facility, work release program, and development of a day reporting center to assist inmates transition into society. Adelanto targeted to open in one year; will have 1400 beds.</p> <p><u>Public Defender Phyllis Morris</u> Doing staff rotation to expand realignment duties. Doing parole hearings; state is involved in these hearings.</p> <p><u>District Attorney Mike Ramos</u> Reorganizing offices more efficiently. Currently staff is spread out and trying to centralize. Increase in cases. Last year reviewed 6800-7000. This year 8000 cases.</p> <p>County has great system and rehabilitation programs. We are a good team.</p>
