# CCP Approval

- In March 2022, the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) voted on the FY 2022/23 allocations for AB109 funding.
- The funding, \$4.9 million ongoing and \$0.7 million one-time money, allowed for the creation of *The MAP*.
  - The Multi-Dimensional Anti-Recidivism Partnership

# Purpose

- *The MAP* program is a multidimensional rehabilitative and community integration program that brings together collaborative partnerships from the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) agencies, the Re-entry Collaborative, and the Custody to Community workgroup.
- The goal is to engage the community in developing rehabilitative programming to promote long-term, self-sustaining, social and independent living skills among justice-involved individuals through treatment, vocational training, and personal development services. The program also seeks to support and protect victims of crime.

# First Steps

- The Probation Department has engaged Real Estate Services and the Building Owner to acquire a 33,798 square foot building located at 2050 N. Massachusetts in the city of San Bernardino.
- This building was found to be highly suitable for engaging the re-entry population in the manner listed in the original MAP proposal.
- A lease agreement is anticipated for late Summer 2022, with tenant improvements planned.

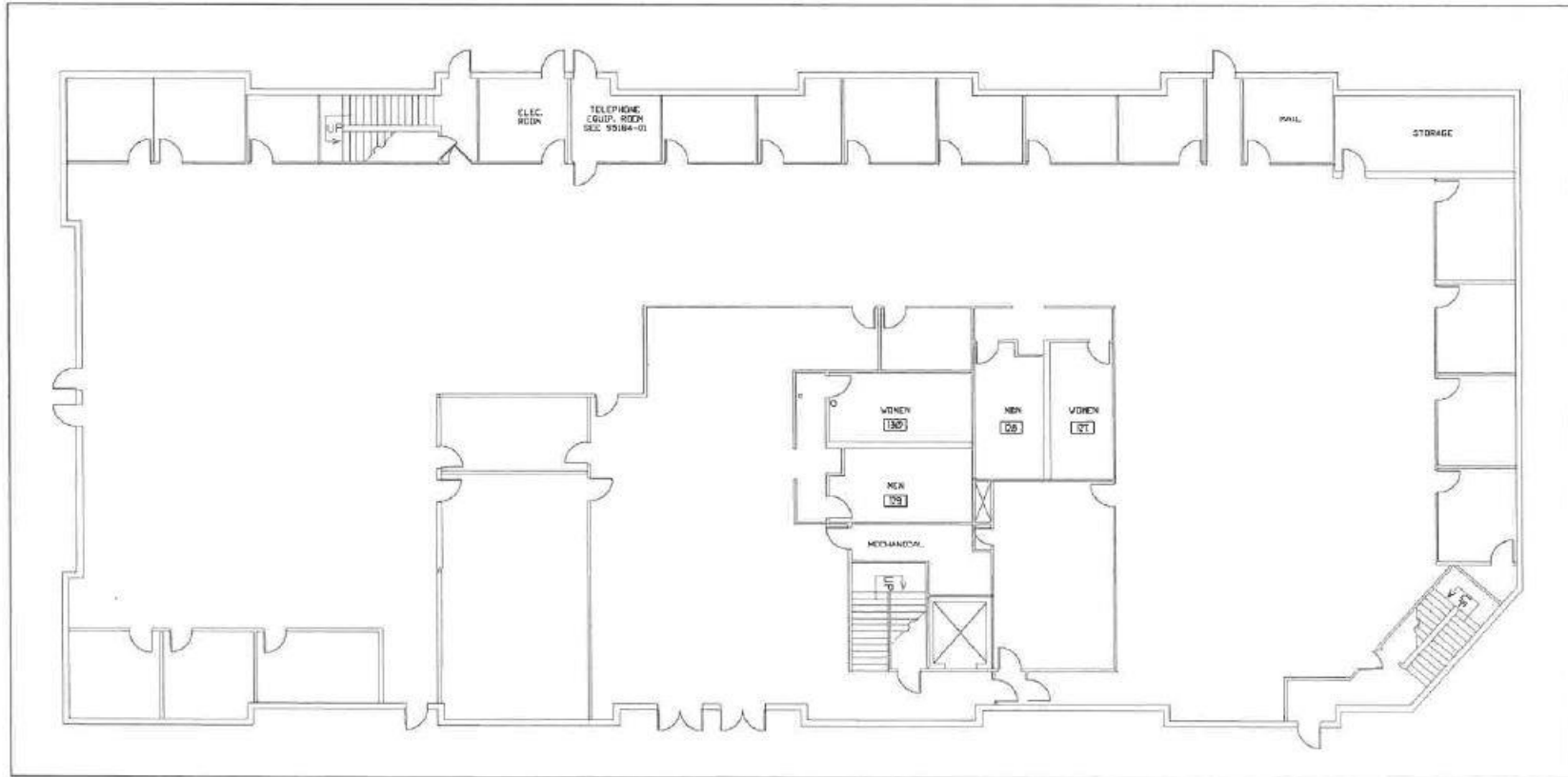

FIRST FLOOR | 2050 MASSACHUSETTS | SAN BERNARDINO



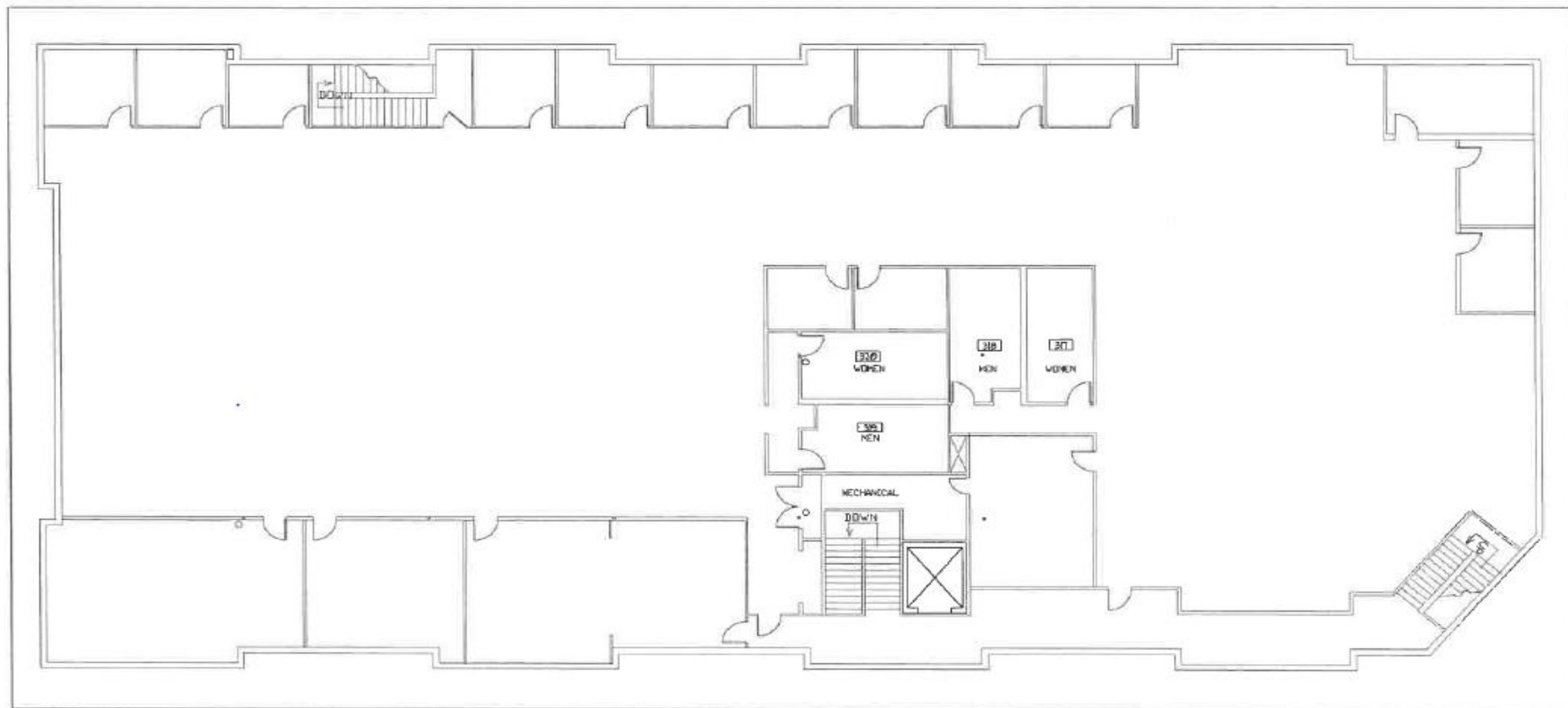

FIRST FLOOR | 2050 MASSACHUSETTS | SAN BERNARDINO



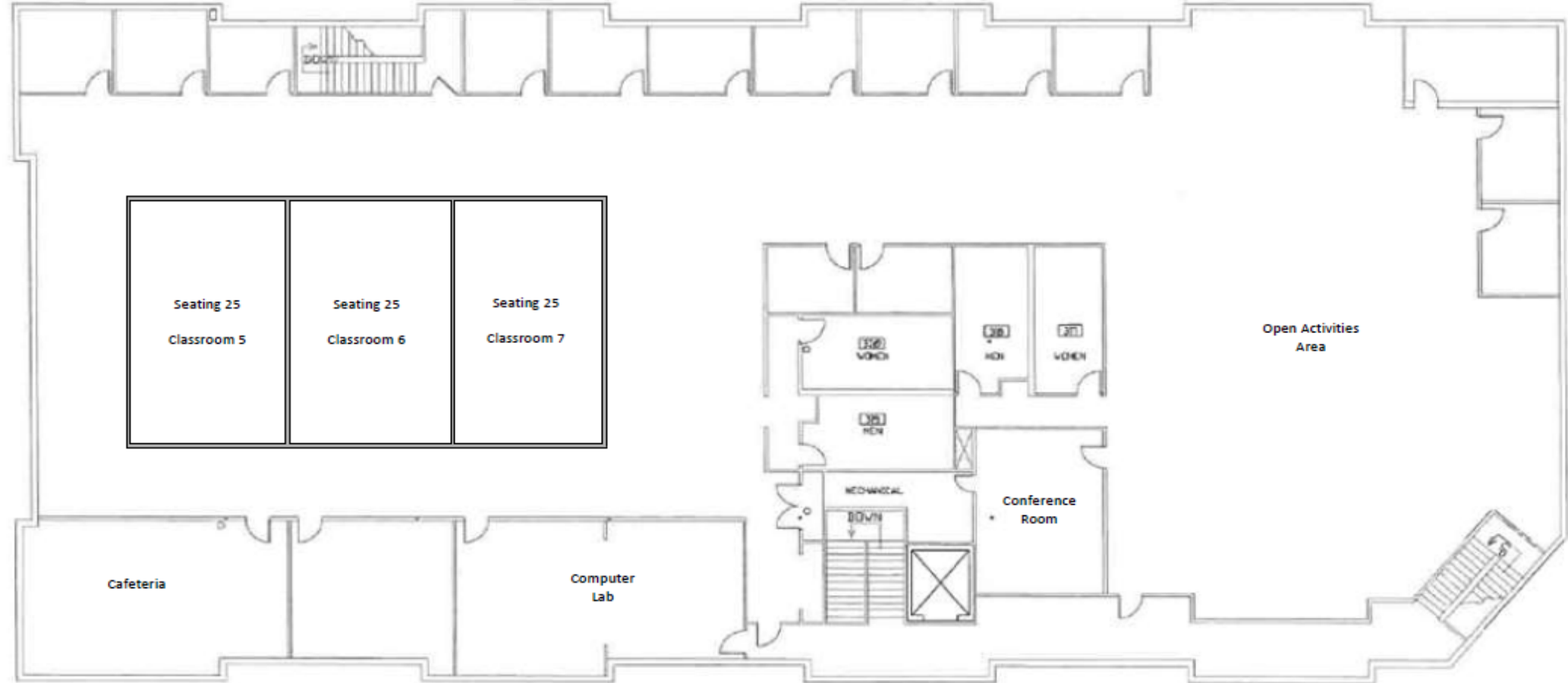
\*Classrooms 1 & 2; 3 & 4 will be divided classes w/25 seats per class or opened to 1 large for 50 max seating

# Future Plans

- The Program is strategically planned to make additional real estate acquisitions, to include:
  - The West End Region
  - The High Desert Region
  - Smaller satellite campus locations:
    - Barstow
    - Morongo Basin
    - Mountain Communities

# Request For Proposal

- The Probation Department is developing a Request for Proposal to contract with a lead professional organization or Community Based Organization as the “Program Administrator”.
- Once the contract has been awarded through the competitive bid process, the Program Administrator will engage service providers and Community Based Organizations to provide services and programming for the re-entry population based on the needs assessment.

# Request for Proposal Continued...

- Simultaneously, the Probation Department is developing an Internal Programming Unit to aid in ensuring all programming:
  - Evidence Based
  - Measurable Outcomes and data driven
  - Stats collections and reporting
- The Probation Department is adding the position of Program Manager that will work in concert with the Program Administrator and will be the department liaison to *The MAP*.

# Collaboration

- The strategic plan of *The MAP* is to promote collaboration with the CCP Partners, the Re-entry Collaborative, and the Custody to Community Collaborative.
- The goal of *The MAP* is to provide services to as many clients as possible in all regions of the county.
- This includes all who are “*Justice Involved*”, and not just those on Probation, Parole, or Supervised Release.



# Collaboration Continued...

- The service providers and Community Based Organizations in all three regions will be contracted to provide the needed programming and services to the re-entry population involved in *The MAP*.
- The plan of *The MAP* is to have services and programming delivered by Community Based Organizations and service providers in each area.
- The Department's Programming Unit and Program Administrator will work together to ensure programming and services are contracted with the community providers.

# Collaboration Continued...

- Also through *The MAP*, the plan is for a seamless transition from the services the clients are receiving while in custody, and continue the process once released.
