Stats are not available, but can be requested o Chief Reece – completing a program does not mean the client is off probation; many non-probationers receive services as well o Chief Tolber asked if the program helped with job placement. Yes, about half of the participants are offered jobs. Some are also offered additional training for better certifications. Round Table / Agenda Building	Sheriff Dicus —The Sheriff's Department is looking at ways to use Glen Helen for individuals with mental health issues or as an overnight homeless shelter; this would assist with capacity issues at alternate facilities. The sheriff's staff has been in discussion with DBH and ARMC. ARMC is not equipped to handle the sex offender population. Glen Helen would need minimal construction. Discussion regarding concerns with using CCP funding.
