Course Name Juvenile Law/Case Law Update

Course Summary (brief description of course)

This is a 4 hour course designed to provide information to staff on recent developments in the criminal justice system and how those changes impact on the job of the probation officer. It will cover the major changes in statutes created or amended by the legislature and how those changes impact on their clients and the way they provide services to the courts. It will also identify changes created by case decisions in the appellate courts and how those decisions impact on their job.
